Apologies for absence were received from Vic Manning, Ron Bishop, Margaret McGinn, Kim Ghafur, Tarik Ghafur, Peter Turner and Janet Turner.

The meeting started at 11.15 am

1. Jackie Goodwin and Beryl Skinner were nominated jointly to chair the meeting, as Reg Rogers was unable to arrive in time.

Proposed by Judith Neville, seconded by Fred Brailey.

- 2. Minutes of AGM 2014 were approved. Proposed by John Glyn and seconded by Fred Brailey.
- 3. Beryl spoke with regard to the Trinity memorabilia at present held by the Association and as to what should happen to it in the event of the closure of the Association. Jackie Goodwin advised that she had been in contact with Bruce Castle who already have Trinity archives, and confirmed that they would be pleased to accept those items they do not hold. Ann Flanagan suggested that any duplicates not required by BC should be offered to members of the Association.

The motion in total was proposed by Fred Brailey, seconded by Doreen Stoddart and agreed by all.

- 4. Appointment of Committee for 2015/16. It was advised that Peter Turner had resigned from the committee due to family commitments. The other members of 2014/2015 committee were willing to stand again .They are: Judith Neville (Crook 52) Mary Davies (Parker–Smith 51) Fred Brailey (50) John Glyn (46) Vic Manning (49) Anne Flanagan (58) Jackie Goodwin (Coulson 56) Beryl Skinner (Hayter 42) Margaret McGinn (Stretton 48). These nominations were accepted and agreed by all. Proposed by Doreen Stoddart, seconded by Alan Rutter.
- 5. Beryl reported on the accounts and confirmed that we have a healthy balance. Ron Bishop(45) who is a retired Accountant had audited them .

Acceptance of the report was agreed by all . Proposed by John Glyn, seconded by Judith Neville

6. Beryl spoke about the possibility of T.O.S.A winding down in the event of not being able to find someone suitable to do the accounts and spoke in particular with regard to Item 11 of the Constitution which gives the serving committee members the authority to donate any money available to a charity of their choice. She felt that members should be able to nominate a charity, bearing in mind the loss of members we have had and <u>are</u> having as an ageing Association. One choice was Cancer Research (UK) but we were reminded by Ann Flanagan that although this is one of most popular charities, one like the Alzheimer's charity does get overlooked. After a short discussion it was suggested that any donation made should be split 50/50 between these two charities and that item 11 of the Constitution amended accordingly. I am sure that many of you will have been enjoying all the musical celebrations that have taken place during 2015 with regard to the 100th Birthday anniversary of Frank Sinatra and the 80th anniversary of the birth of Elvis Presley. They both became such icons during their lives, and those of us who became "fans" will have found listening again to their voices full of memories! If anyone is interested I can recommend a new DVD of **Elvis Presley with the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra** which has been produced by his wife Priscilla and Don Reedman.

Nearer to home, I was delighted to find that one of our own, (Elaine Delmar (Hutchinson 51) was appearing at the Royal Albert Hall as a "Proms Debut Artist" From the actual program of the concert...

Elaine was born in Hertfordshire, the daughter of Leslie 'Jiver' Hutchinson, who was influential in the dance-band movement from the 1930's. Elaine became a singer in her father's band at the age of 16.

She has made numerous radio and television broadcasts around the world. On stage she has appeared in the West End and on Broadway in **Kern goes to Hollywood**. In London **Bubbling Brown Sugar** (Royalty Theatre) **No Strings** (Her Majesty's) and **Cowardy Custard** (Mermaid). She played the Bohemian Princess in Ken Russell's film **Mahler** and in 1983 appeared at the National Theatre in David Hare's play **A map of the World**.

Having worked at Ronnie Scott's on numeral occasions, a career highlight was to sing at the venue's 50th anniversary celebrations in 2009 and in 2013 she received the All-Parliamentary Special Award for Services to Jazz.

A short history of her life paints a picture of this very special lady, who won a scholarship to Trinity Grammar School in 1939. She excelled at netball and took up fencing when she left school and was later to become Southern Area Champion. It had been Yvonne's ambition to be a P.E. teacher, but as she was a meticulous shorthand typist with an interest in medicine, she soon progressed from the 'Path Lab' and was taken under the wing of a top pathologist. Her brother George had also become a pupil at Trinity, and at his wedding Don Grammer was best man and Yvonne a bridesmaid.
