ALLOCATION OF PUPILS OF 11 TO SECONDARY SCHOOLS IN 1950.

This letter sets out the arrangements for 1950 for the transfer of pupils aged 11 years from primary to secondary schools.

1. Secondary Schools will provide the following kinds of schooling:-

- (a) SECONDARY MODERN. Most children learn best by following courses rooted in their own interests and day to day experiences. A Secondary Modern School provides a good all-round education which enables such children to develop freely. In addition to a general education up to the age of 15, many of these Schools offer courses for children over the compulsory school age.
- (b) SECONDARY GRAMMAR. Children attending a Secondary Grammar School must be capable of following an intensive academic course in subjects such as mathematics and modern languages, lasting at least five years and leading to examinations of the standard of the School Certificate and Higher School Certificate. In 1951 the School and Higher School Certificates will be replaced by the General Certificate of Education. Pupils over 16 years of age will be eligible to take the examinations for this certificate at the Ordinary, Advanced and Scholarship levels.
- (c) SECONDARY TECHNICAL. Some children who will make their careers in branches of industry, commerce or agriculture require a specialised course such as that provided in the Secondary Technical Schools. Transfer to technical schools in Middlesex is made by selection at the age of 13 years. Full information is sent out separately on the selection of pupils for these Schools, and on the transfer of pupils of 13 years of age to alternative forms of secondary education.

The Comprehensive Secondary Schools at Hayes, Potters Bar and Uxbridge will offer combinations of the kinds of schooling given in the existing secondary schools.

You should discuss your child's secondary education with the Head Teacher of the School he/she is now attending. If you wish your child to attend a Grammar School, you should read the following notes very carefully.

- 2. The conditions applying to the transfer of children to Grammar Schools under the County Council's arrangements are as follows:—
 - (i) The child must be normally resident in Middlesex.

(ii) The age qualifications are :-

For admission to a Grammar School in 1950, children must have been born during the period 1st August, 1938, to 31st August, 1939, both dates inclusive. Children born during August, 1939, however, may take the County tests as normal age candidates in February, 1950, or in February, 1951, or both and if not transferred to a Grammar School in 1950 they will remain in their Junior Schools until 1951

In exceptional cases, under-age and over-age candidates will be considered as follows:

- (a) A child born between the 1st September, 1939, and 31st December, 1939 (both dates inclusive), may be considered if specially recommended by the Head Teacher of his/her present school as a pupil of exceptional ability.
- present school as a pupil of exceptional ability.

 (b) A child born between the 1st August, 1937, and 31st July, 1938 (both dates inclusive) may be considered as an over-age candidate providing written application is made to the Head Teacher of the child's present school without delay.
- (c) No child under the age of 11 years on the 31st December, 1950, will be considered for transfer to a Grammar School.
- (iii) All children of the appropriate age will be expected to take the County tests of Intelligence, English and Arithmetic. Individual marks and positions are regarded as strictly confidential and cannot be made known to parents.
- (iv) The child must show at the County tests that he/she is likely to benefit most from the kind of courses provided at a Grammar School. Performance in these tests together with Head Teachers' reports and recommendations will be taken to indicate suitability for a Grammar School course.
- (v) Ordinarily, tests will be taken in the child's own school although it may be necessary for candidates from certain small schools to attend at other centres. In these cases, parents will be notified by the Education Officer for the area, or by the Head Teacher of the School, as to which centre the child should attend.
- (vi) If a child is prevented by illness or some other sufficient cause from taking the tests at the arranged time, an opportunity will be made for him/her to take a similar set of tests at a later date.
- (vii) If your child qualifies for a Grammar School course, he/she should attend one of the schools listed in Section A on pages 2 and 3. On page 4 you are asked to indicate your order of preference for particular schools selected from the list, and in making your choice you should pay particular attention to the nearness of the school to your home and to the convenience of transport. In addition, in Section B on page 3 is given a list of Direct Grant and Independent Schools at which fees are normally payable, and to which a very small number of suitably qualified children may be sent as free place holders. Because of the small number of places, it will not be possible to consider a child for more than one of the schools in Section B. You are therefore requested not to include more than one of the schools in Section B in your list of preferences.
- (viii) You should also complete the application form on page 4 and return it to the Head Teacher of the School your child is attending as soon as possible and, in any case, not later than 24th January, 1950. If your child attends a Private School, you should return the application form direct to the local Education Officer of your area, in any case not later than 24th January, 1950.
- 3. If you have any enquiries which are not answered by this letter, I should be glad if you would enquire of the Head Teacher of the School your child attends or of the local Education Officer.
