The Old Trinity Scholars' Association was founded in 1924, in order to keep scholars interested in their old School, to keep them in touch with one another, and to establish among them any activities for which there was need.

Membership of the Association is open to past scholars of the Trinity County School, the Bounds Green County Schools, the Wood Green Central Schools, and the Higher Grade Schools. The annual subscription is 3/- and is payable in September of each year. Pupils of the School who leave at the end of the Autumn or Spring Term join the Association at a reduced subscription.

Members are entitled:

- 1. To receive a membership card containing a list of Officers, Committee, and Secretaries of Sections, and Fixtures for the Session.
- 2. To receive by post each term a copy of the School Magazine, the last section of which contains news of Old Scholars.
- 3. To meet at the School every Friday evening during the Autumn and Spring Terms.
- 4. To be kept in touch with the activities of the School and the Association by circulars sent out at intervals.
- 5. To attend the various meetings of the Association.
- 6. To become members of the sections of the Association on condition that they observe the section rules approved by the Committee, and pay the section subscription (if any).
- 7. To receive annually a list of members and their addresses.

Hockey Club (Old Girls) Operatic Society Dramatic Society Country Club

The Committee will always consider the formation of new sections.

The Business of the Association is conducted by a Committee elected at a General Meeting held at the School in the September of each year. The Committee by its constitution is representative of past scholars who were pupils of the School during any period from the Higher Grade days to last year. Thus any past scholar who is a member of the Association is eligible for election to the Committee.

The Annual Subscriptions should be paid to the Treasurer and all communications should be addressed to the Secretary.

The Association has been successful since its inception. It has enabled Old Scholars to keep in touch with the School, and to continue old, and to form new, friendships. Through its members it has materially aided the School by informing the Head Master of openings for scholars requiring posts.
